	President Xi Jinping Consolidates Power at 19 th Party Congress; Government to Play Greater Role in Private Sector

The 19th Party Congress marked a milestone in Chinese President Xi Jinping's consolidation of power and gave insights into the future direction of economic policy in China. A Project Syndicate article by Stephen Roach, a senior fellow at Yale University's Jackson Institute of Global Affairs, argues that the Party's re-framing of China's "principal contradiction" from one of "backward social production," to focus on "unbalanced and inadequate development" and the "people's ever-growing needs for a better life" signals a far-reaching change in national perspective - from that of a poor developing country to that of an increasingly prosperous society focused on becoming a Great Power. <u>China Daily</u> reviewed the positive reception toward the One Belt, One Road initiative, which has since been included in the China's party charter, at the recent annual IMF and World Bank meetings. A Nikkei Asian Review article analyzed how the government is increasingly exerting power in the corporate sector through greater party intervention and influence. An Ei Insight article discussed how Xi's policy message could spur development of the rental property market, which lags behind the home purchase market.

Decisive Win for Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe

Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's coalition won a two-thirds supermajority in Japan's snap elections, allowing Prime Minister Abe to pursue his policy agenda with greater vigor. An article by the Japan Times discussed domestic policies expected from Prime Minister Abe, including more government spending on Abenomics policies, a ¥2 trillion policy package to be directed at human resources development, a consumption tax hike from eight to ten percent, and increased financing of welfare programs. Another Japan Times article outlined the expectation that this week's talks between U.S. President Donald Trump and Prime Minister Abe will emphasize geopolitical issues, primarily the North Korean nuclear threat and territorial disagreements in the East and South China seas, rather than Japan-U.S. trade. An SCMP article outlined why Prime Minister Abe's goal of revising the pacifist constitution poses major geopolitical and economic threats to Japan.

Growing Anti-Globalization Sentiments Demonstrate Need for New Solutions

The continuing appeal of anti-globalization political parties illustrates governments' inability to address the underlying causes of antiglobalization sentiments. Shashi Tharor, a current MP for the Indian National Congress, argued in a **Project Syndicate** article that the backlash against globalization not only stems from growing inequality but resistance to multiculturalism and cosmopolitanism. A Project Syndicate article by Michael Spence, a Nobel laureate in economics, asserted that although it helps to understand non-inclusive growth,

what matters now is strengthening shared values and objectives to develop broader political consensus for implementing an effective growth model. We know what the elements of good growth are; the problem is a lack of social or political agreement to put these ingredients in place.
