- ★ Tony Fernandes of AirAsia was named the winner of the Asia House Asian Business Leaders Award for 2017 for his contributions to Asia's economic landscape. He also discussed his vision for AirAsia in ten years and opportunities that data and AI offer, leadership, and his outlook on the airline industry in interviews with Bloomberg.
- ♦ Peter Grauer of Bloomberg was named one of the top ally executives by the Financial Times.
- ♦ Alan Joyce of Qantas Airways Ltd. commented on the arrival of the 787-9 Dreamliner aircraft, which will open up new routes and allow for Australia's first non-stop air link to Europe. He also topped the *Financial Times* global LGBT executive list.
- ♦ Douglas Tong Hsu of Far Eastern Group commented on the 19th Party Congress and excess capacity in China in an interview with CNBC.
- ☆ Amin Nasser of Saudi Aramco was awarded the Distinguished Lifetime Achievement Award by the Society of Petroleum Engineers. He also commented on plans to invest in India through the creation of a fully integrated business, predicted in an interview with CNBC that the electric vehicles market will grow, spoke on a panel at Saudi Arabia's Future Investment Initiative, and discussed the future of oil in a New York Times interview.
- ♦ Penny Pritzker of PSP Capital Partners was nominated to join Microsoft's board of directors.
- ♦ Yasuhiro Sato of Mizuho Financial Group urged financial institutions to start implementing blockchain technology.
- Stan Shih of Acer Group announced that Acer will transition into a holding company.
- ♦ Dong-Bin Shin of Lotte Group established a new online shopping website, iLotte, with fellow ABC member Anthoni Salim of Salim Group.

President Xi Jinping Consolidates Power at 19th Party Congress; Government to Play Greater Role in Private Sector

The 19th Party Congress marked a milestone in Chinese President Xi Jinping's consolidation of power and gave insights into the future direction of economic policy in China. A *Project Syndicate* article by Stephen Roach, a senior fellow at Yale University's Jackson Institute of Global Affairs, argues that the Party's re-framing of China's "principal contradiction" from one of "backward social production," to focus on "unbalanced and inadequate development" and the "people's ever-growing needs for a better life" signals a far-reaching change in national perspective – from that of a poor developing country to that of an increasingly prosperous society focused on becoming a Great Power. *China Daily* reviewed the reception for China's One Belt, One Road initiative, which has since been <u>included</u> in the party's charter, at the recent annual IMF and World Bank meetings. A *Nikkei Asian Review* article analyzed how the government is increasingly exerting power in the corporate sector through greater party intervention and influence. An *Ej Insight* article discussed how Xi's policy message about rental housing could spur development of the rental property market, which lags behind the purchase market.

Decisive Win for Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe

Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's coalition won a two-thirds supermajority in Japan's snap elections, allowing Abe to continue pursuing his policy agenda, including Abenomics and plans to amend the pacifist constitution. An article by the <u>Japan Times</u> discussed domestic policies expected from Abe, including more government spending on Abenomics policies, a ¥2 trillion policy package to be directed at human resources development, a consumption tax hike from eight to ten percent, and increased financing of welfare programs. Another <u>Japan Times</u> article outlined the expectation that talks between U.S. President Donald Trump and Prime Minister Shinzo Abe next week will emphasize geopolitical issues, such as the North Korean nuclear threat and territorial disagreements in the East and South China seas, over economic issues, such as a Japan-U.S. FTA. Another <u>SCMP</u> article outlined why Prime Minister Abe's goal of revising the pacifist constitution poses major geopolitical and economic threats to Japan.

Growing Anti-Globalization Sentiments Demonstrate Need for New Solutions As Appeal of Populist Parties Continue

The increasing presence of anti-globalization sentiments and protectionist policies in global politics illustrate how governments are once again failing to effectively address electorate concerns that more globalization will mean even greater economic inequality. Shashi Tharor, a current MP for the Indian National Congress, argued in a *Project Syndicate* article that the backlash against globalization stems not only from growing inequality but resistance to multiculturalism and cosmopolitanism. Another *Project Syndicate* article by Michael Spence, a Nobel

laureate in economics, asserted that although analysis of why non-inclusive growth persists is important, a renewed emphasis on strengthening shared values and objectives at the national level is more crucial, because it helps develop broader political consensus.
